

NOTIFICATION – BARANGAROO STATION | 8 MAY 2018

Sydney Metro is Australia’s biggest public transport project.

Services start in 2019 in the city’s North West with a train every four minutes in the peak. Metro rail will be extended into the CBD and beyond to Bankstown in 2024. Sydney Metro includes new CBD railway stations underground at Martin Place, Pitt Street and Barangaroo and new metro platforms under Central.

In 2024, Sydney Metro will have 31 stations on a new 66km rail system – the biggest urban rail project in Australian history. Sydney Metro will have ultimate capacity for a train every two minutes in each direction under the CBD.

John Holland CPB Ghella Joint Venture (JHCPBG) has been awarded the \$2.81 billion contract to build the twin railway tunnels from Chatswood to Sydenham and excavate six new Sydney Metro stations.

Out-of-hours works – Barangaroo Station site and Millers Point

Out-of-hours works will continue from **Tuesday 15 May to Tuesday 29 May 2018**, weather and site conditions permitting. Due to high daytime traffic volumes and to ensure pedestrian safety, these works will be carried out between **8pm and 5am Monday to Friday**. Out-of-hours work will occur on a maximum of three nights per week in a particular location, with a maximum of 10 nights per month.

Extended hours during weekend works – Acoustic shed site, Millers Point

To minimise the amount of night works needed to build the acoustic shed, extended work hours will continue on **Saturdays and Sundays between 8am and 6pm until late May 2018**, subject to weather conditions. Some activities such as wall installation and cladding will still need to be done at night.

Works will involve:

- Establishing worksites, including safety and environmental controls
- Delivering plant and equipment
- Using jack hammers, drills, saw cutters, vacuum trucks, excavators and compactors
- Using large cranes and elevated work platforms to install shed walls and cladding
- Laying pipes and conduits
- Reinstating excavated areas and demobilising the temporary worksites.

What to expect

- There will be temporary single lane closures on Hickson Road during out-of-hours and extended hours works. Traffic control and directional signage will be in place for the safety of workers and the community.
- There will be intermittent periods of noisy works. High-impact noise activities such as saw cutting and hammering will be carried out as early as possible during night works and will cease before midnight.
- Non-tonal reversing beepers will be used, and workers will be instructed to keep noise to a minimum.
- Temporary lighting will be used to ensure a safe work site and will be directed away from properties.
- Increased light vehicle and truck movements.
- Equipment used includes drills, vacuum trucks, mobile cranes, elevated work platforms, concrete saws and chainsaws, excavators, rock hammers and compactors.
- Access to the High Steps, Nawi Cove and Barangaroo Reserve will be maintained at all times.
- Access to properties will be maintained at all times.
